Scholarships and Bursaries

St George's College offers awards to students new to the College and those continuing in their residence.



Students entering their first year of university studies

Reynolds Scholarship

Established by The Georgians (the former student association) and now supported by the Foundation*, the Scholarship perpetuates the memory of Dr J H Reynolds, a former Warden of St George's.

Former recipients have been students commencing their tertiary studies with high academic ability as indicated by TEE results as well as other interests.

The value of the Scholarship is equivalent to one-third fee remission for three years.

The Phillip Roberts Memorial Scholarship

Initiated by colleagues and friends and now supported by the Foundation*, this Scholarship was established in memory of Richard Phillip Roberts a Senior Tutor of St George's College for 18 years.

Mr Roberts was, at various times, a lecturer in Agricultural Economics at UWA, Officer-in-Charge of the Western Australian Department of Agriculture, Secretary of the State Committee of CSIRO and Secretary of the Food and Agricultural Organisation of UNO.

The Scholarship is awarded to the best Western Australian student with a country background commencing their tertiary studies.

The value of the Scholarship is equivalent to one-third fee remission for one year.

The Winthrop Scholarship

The Winthrop Scholarship was established by the Board of St George's College in recognition of Sir John Winthrop Hackett KCMG LLD, the Founder of the College.

Judged on the basis of character, school record and TEE results, the Scholarship is awarded each year to the best Western Australian applicant entering The University for the first time.

The value of the Scholarship is equivalent to \$1,500 fee remission for one year.

RCR Tomlinson Bursary

Provided by RCR Tomlinson Ltd, this Bursary is designed to assist a first year engineering student residing at St George's College.

Special consideration is given to those students who are enduring financial hardship.

The value of this Bursary is \$1,000 fee remission for the year awarded.

Entrance Bursaries

The Georgian Entrance Bursary and College Entrance Bursaries are offered to those commencing their studies at St George's College and The University.

The Bursaries are designed to assist students who are keen to do well in a tertiary course and are aimed at encouraging students to become a part of the community life of St George's.

The Bursaries are awarded on the grounds of merit and need.

The Georgian Entrance Bursary is valued at \$2,000 fee remission for one year.

The Board Entrance Bursaries are each valued at \$1,000 fee remission for one year.

Students continuing their university studies

Alcoa of Australia Ltd Scholarship

The Scholarship, established through the Foundation* by Alcoa of Australia, is designed for students who are continuing their engineering studies at The University, giving special consideration to female students.

Applicants should demonstrate certain all-round qualities in terms of sports participation, student affairs and other, worthwhile community extra-curricular activities.

The value of the Scholarship is one third fee remission for one year (past recipients may re-apply for the scholarship for up to three years).

J M Wolff Scholarship

Established through the Foundation* by Rabbi William Wolff in memory of his brother Dr Joachim Wolff, a lecturer in The University's Department of German and resident of St George's College, this Scholarship is designed to support a student enrolled in the Department of Music and residing at St George's College.

The successful applicant will give or organise at least one concert for the College Community.

The value of the Scholarship is one third fee remission for one year.

W T Harrison Tertiary Bursaries

These Bursaries were established in memory of Walter Tom Harrison and are now administered by the Foundation*.

Special consideration is given to students whose home is outside the metropolitan area and who have an interest in the tertiary study of Law, Medicine or Pharmacy. Applicants should demonstrate an interest in general College activities.

The value of each of these Bursaries is one third fee remission for one year.

Grecian Snook Memorial Bursary

Established through the Foundation*, the Grecian Snook Memorial Bursary was set up in memory of the late Grecian Snook who served nobly as a wife and mother at Meckering during the stressful pioneering era from 1887 onwards

The successful applicant will wish to continue with their studies to obtain a degree from the Faculty of Natural and Agricultural Sciences and have demonstrated admirable qualities in terms of College involvement and extra-curricular activities. Special consideration will be given to those who reside outside the metropolitan area and/or those who have a special need for residence at the College.

The value of the Bursary is one third fee remission for one year.

L C Hodge Bursary

Established through the Foundation* in memory of the late Lesley Cameron Hodge, this Bursary is tenable by students residing at St George's and enrolled in the faculties of Life and Physical Sciences or Natural and Agricultural Science.

The value of the Bursary is one third fee remission for one year.

Sadka Scholarship

Established by a bequest to the Foundation* made by Fred Sadka, this Scholarship is awarded to a promising student who has a special need for residence in the College.

The successful applicant should be promising academically but not necessarily brilliant.

The value of the Scholarship is one sixth fee remission for one year.

Olsen Scholarship

Established by a bequest to the Foundation* made by the late C O Olsen, this Scholarship is tenable by students who have completed two semesters at The University in the Faculty of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences, Life and Physical Sciences or the Faculty of Engineering, Computing and Mathematics.

Two scholarships are awarded each year.

The value of each Scholarship is one sixth fee remission for one year.

R F L & C H Glover Memorial Bursary

This Bursary was established by former resident of St George's College, Dr John Glover, through the Foundation*, in memory of his parents, Rhoda Florence Lulu and Cecil Herbert Glover.

The successful applicant will be enrolled in courses administered by the Faculty of Natural and Agricultural Sciences (School of Earth and Geographical Sciences). Special consideration is given to those who reside outside the metropolitan area.

The value of the Bursary is one third fee remission for one year.

Gascoine Memorial Bursary

This Bursary was set up through the Foundation* by the family of the late Lewis Rose Gascoine who believed that travel and experience (not necessarily connected with the chosen field of study) was an integral part of the improvement of education and recognised that some students were disadvantaged by not having the means or the financial support to undertake such travel.

The successful applicant will be enrolled at St George's and The University, proceeding to their next academic year and will continue in residence in the next academic year. Applicants must outline the travel experience they hope to undertake and how it may impact their University Experience.

The Bursary will pay up to the equivalent of one third fees towards travel and living expenses of the successful applicant.

Maxwell Newton Scholarship

This Scholarship was established through the Foundation* in memory of Maxwell Newton.

Mr Newton was the founding editor of the Australian newspaper – an extraordinary multi-talented man of ideas who pushed the envelope throughout his life.

The Scholarship has been established to assist students to broaden their thinking by travelling and so stretch their capacity to contribute innovative thought to the Australian way of life. Applicants must outline the travel experience they hope to undertake and how it may impact their University Experience.

The value of the Scholarship is up to one sixth of College fees for the year awarded.

How to apply

Prepare a resume (or curriculum vitae) no longer than three pages.

Attach your resume to a cover letter. This letter is your opportunity to outline the reason/s you should be considered for the various scholarships and bursaries offered by St George's College.

Submit your cover letter and resume when you accept (or renew) your offer to St George's College.
